
EQUIPMENT LENDING LIBRARY

REACH hours: Tuesday - Saturday, 10am-4:30pm.


COASTAL SALISH WEAVERS

Before You Touch Your Fiber
For Coast Salish people, the practice of weaving starts long before you even touch the wool, says Snumith'ye (Violet Elliott) master weaver living in the traditional territory of the Cowichan Tribes. A weaver using wooly dog fur would express gratitude for the wool, pray, plan their patterns and materials, set intentions, and get into the right headspace before beginning, she explains.
