A VERY MERRY SUCCESS



Pam Root brings a variety of projects to our Rigid Heddle meetings. Last summer our group took a challenge from the magazine Little Looms. It was weaving a Scottish tartan. In the first photo below Pam is wearing the Johnstone tartan she wove. She wove it with super wash Merino.

In the second photo we see her Navajo tapestry weaving. For the past 15 summers, she has gone to weaving classes in the Navajo nation in Arizona and New Mexico. There, Pam weaves with 8 friends who have been in classes with her all of the past 15 years. They use churro sheep yarn. Navajo weaving is tapestry weaving. This loom has been great for weaving blankets, towels, wash cloths and rugs.

- A front beam canvas tray, made by Gilmore Looms, Stockton, CA
- A warping wedge from Gilmore Looms that allows shafts to be held at different levels while threading the reed
- Lease sticks
- 50" raddle
- 26" 10 dent stainless steel reed
- 40" 12 dent stainless steel reed
- 40" 8 dent old style steel reed
- Magnetic strip on castle for holding drafts and notes
- A wood rug beater


